Continued retention of the law firm Earl L. Neal & Associates, L.L.C..

DESCRIPTION: The law firm Earl L. Neal & Associates, L.L.C. has been engaged to provide varied legal services in support of the Capital Improvement Program. The firm provides assistance to the General Counsel and Chief Operating Officer in land acquisition matters and in obtaining various regulatory approvals required as part of the acquisition process. Currently, there are pending invoices from the firm in the amount of \$286,823.80. In addition, there are further anticipated fees and costs for the remainder of this fiscal year which are estimated at \$125,000. Additional authorization is requested in the amount of \$415,000 for these past and anticipated fees and costs. As future invoices are received, they will be reviewed by the General Counsel and, if satisfactory, processed for payment.

Contingent Liability - The agreement shall contain the clause that any expenditure beyond the current fiscal year is deemed a contingent liability, subject to appropriation in the subsequent f iscal year budget(s).
