Retention of the law firm Laner, Muchin, Dombrow, Becker, Levin & Tominberg.

DESCRIPTION: The General Counsel has retained the services of the law firm Laner, Muchin, Dombrow, Becker, Levin & Tominberg to provide representation to the Board and individually-named employees in the matter captioned <u>Ferguson v. Board, et al.</u> in the U.S. District Court and representation of an individually-named employee in the matter captioned <u>Brogan v. Board, et al.</u> now pending in U.S. District Court. Additional authorization is requested in the <u>Ferguson</u> matter in the amount of \$50,000; additional authorization in <u>Brogan</u> is requested in the amount of \$15,000. As invoices are received, they will be reviewed by the General Counsel and, if satisfactory, processed for payment.

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

Conflicts - The agreement shall not be legally binding on the Board if entered into in violation of the provisions of 105 ILCS 5/34-21.3 which restricts the employment of, or the letting of contracts to, former Board Members during the one year period following expiration or other termination of their terms of office.

Indebtedness - The Board's Indebtedness Policy adopted July 26, 1995, (95-0726-EX3), as amended from time to time, is hereby incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Ethics - The Board's Ethics Code adopted September 27, 1995, (95-0927-RU3), as amended from time to time, is hereby incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Contingent Liability - The agreement shall contain the clause that any expenditure beyond the current fiscal year is deemed a contingent liability, subject to appropriation in the subsequent fiscal year budget(s).
