**APPROVE THE EXPANSION OF OGDEN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL WITH THE ESTABLISHMENT OF
A HIGH SCHOOL CAMPUS TO BE KNOWN AS OGDEN INTERNATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL
PROGRAM**

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER RECOMMENDS THE FOLLOWING DECISION:

That the Board approve the high school grade expansion of the Ogden Elementary School with the establishment of a high school campus to be known as the Ogden International High School Program ("OIHSP") as and as a Renaissance Performance School.

This March 2009 amendment is necessary to (a) identify that OIHSP will be located at 1250 W. Erie and (b) to establish a performance school overlay attendance boundary for the school.

This February 2012 amendment is necessary to modify the admission process for OIHSP for consistency with the International Baccalaureate ("IB") Program in neighborhood high schools.

DESCRIPTION:

School Designation: OIHSP is scheduled to open in the fall of 2009 at 1250 W. Erie as an expansion to the Ogden Elementary School as a Performance School in accordance with Board's Renaissance Schools Policy, 07-0627-PO4, as amended ("Renaissance Policy"). Whereas Ogden sixth through eighth graders are currently located at 1250 W. Erie, the high school grade expansion will also continue at this site. This site will require that OIHSP share its facility with Carpenter Elementary School. The two schools will share their facility in accordance with the Board's Shared Facility Policy, 05-0126-PO1.

Public Hearing: A public hearing on the opening of OIHSP was held on October 6, 2008 at the William B. Ogden Elementary School, 24 W. Walton, Chicago, IL 60610 and on October 15, 2008 at Board Chambers, in accordance with Renaissance Policy. The October 15, 2008 hearing was recorded. A summary report of both hearings is available for review. A public hearing was held on March 20, 2009 at the Children and Youth Services Building, located at 1615 W. Chicago. The hearing was recorded. A summary report of the hearing is available for review.

Request for Proposals: In April 2008, the Office of New Schools issued a Request for Proposals to solicit responses from parties interested in starting schools under the Renaissance 2010 Initiative. Design Frameworks to operate either a charter campus, contract school, or performance school were submitted by interested parties on June 2, 2008. Supplemental proposal materials for approved design frameworks were submitted on July 28, 2008. Proposals were evaluated pursuant to the standards set forth in the Renaissance Policy. Proposals were reviewed by the Office of New Schools and a Comprehensive Evaluation Team and recommendations were submitted to the Chief Executive Officer based upon those reviews and evaluations.

School Design Team: The proposal for the establishment of OIHSP was submitted by the members of the William B. Ogden School design team including the Principal, LSC members, Program Director, Operations Manager, teachers as well as consultants with high school and Renaissance 2010 experience.

School Profile: OIHSP is scheduled to open in the fall of 2009 serving approximately 150 students in grade 9. In subsequent years the school will add grades 10, 11, and 12 serving at capacity up to 600 students. Ogden Elementary School 8th graders may transition to the OIHSP as 9th graders and once a site is identified the process for the enrollment of additional students and the establishing of any attendance boundaries will be presented to the Board for approval. OIHSP will build on the success of Ogden Elementary by preparing students for post-secondary education and lifelong success in the global economy. The curriculum will be comprehensive, emphasizing global studies, humanities and liberal arts while incorporating advanced technology designed to maximize student achievement, increase student

readiness to advance to the next level, and engage students in authentic and meaningful learning experiences. OIHSP will embed internationalism in all aspects of the educational program, providing opportunities for students to relate curricular concepts to global issues, emphasizing authentic student work and objectives focusing on synthesis and evaluation. Since its inception, OIHSP has offered an IB program for its high school students.

Attendance Boundary: Effective March 25, 2009, a performance school overlay boundary for OIHSP will be established as described below:

Beginning at Ashland Ave and Division St
East to North Branch of the Chicago River
South along the North Branch of the Chicago River to Kinzie St
West to Ashland Av
North to the starting point

Under the Board's Enrollment and Transfer Policy (08-0827-PO2), students currently enrolled in Ogden's eighth grade are entitled to enroll in its ninth grade class and continue until high school graduation. ~~A lottery will be held to select students residing in the performance school overlay boundary for 50% of the remaining seats, and then all remaining applicants (from within and outside of the performance school overlay boundary) will be selected through a second lottery.~~ All other students (both students residing in the overlay boundary and citywide) seeking enrollment in OIHSP's ninth grade class must submit an application in accordance with the Options for Knowledge Publication. Beginning with enrollment for the 2012-2013 school year, the remaining seats will be filled in accordance with the high school IB program selection process specified in the in the Board's Admissions Policy for Magnet, Selective Enrollment, and Other Options for Knowledge Schools and Programs (11-0824-PO2).

Governance: The Ogden Elementary School Local School Council will continue and may be modified at a later date in order to allow for high school student representation.

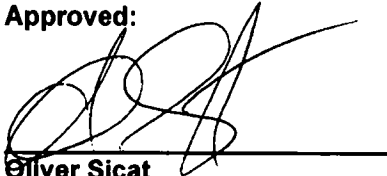
Performance Plan: The operation and performance of the OIHSP will be in accordance with a Performance Plan to be established pursuant the Renaissance Policy and approval of the Board. At a minimum, the Performance Plan will address student academic outcomes and financial and management practices of the school.

CONTINGENT APPROVAL: The granting of the establishment of the school by the Board and the entering into an evaluation performance plan is contingent upon the ability of the school design team meeting benchmarks detailed by the Office of New Schools including but not limited to, securing a facility and developing a remediation plan. These benchmarks will be communicated to the school design team in a formal Memo of Conditions with all deadlines to be met by April 15, 2009. The Office of New Schools will oversee the enforcement of these deadlines; failure to meet these deadlines may, at the option of the Board, result in the rescission of the authority granted herein and the denial of the performance school application. The Chief Executive Officer or his designee will file a report, approved by the General Counsel as to legal form, indicating the CEO's final approval or denial of the performance school application and satisfactory resolution of all material issues related to the formation of the school. The report will be filed with the Secretary of the Board on or before May 15, 2009. This final review will be conducted to determine compliance with the terms indicated above.

FINANCIAL: Using current year financial data, the General Fund cost of 150 students in 2009-10 will be approximately \$1,158,600.00. The financial implications will be addressed during the development of the 2009-2010 fiscal year budget. Since the School Code of Illinois prohibits the incurring of any liability unless an appropriation has been previously made, expenditures beyond FY09 are deemed to be contingent liabilities only, subject to appropriation in subsequent fiscal year budgets.

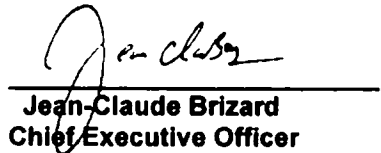

Performance Schools are subject to the collective bargaining agreements between CPS and the Chicago Teachers Union and other labor organizations, including the waiver provisions of those agreements.
