








Chicago makes outsized gains




Chicago's Graduation Rate Increases to All-time High

CPS freshmen are more likely to be “on-track” than peers in similar districts


Percent of “Freshmen On-Track” in Illinois school districts with student populations that are at least 75% Black and Latino and 75% low-income, 2014.





CPS' Black, Latino, and Low-Income students are more likely to graduate H.S. than their peers in similar districts


5-yr high school graduation rates for Black students, by district, 2014.

5-yr high school graduation rates for Latino students, by district, 2014.




