Integrated Facility Management

WHAT IS IFM?

- A vertical management model that aligns all facility services under one provider
- Creates greater efficiencies in managing all areas of facilities including custodial, engineering, maintenance repairs, emergency repairs, engineer scheduling, custodial scheduling, equipment and supply purchasing, pest management, landscaping and snow removal
- Aligning the services under one provider removes silos and some of the barriers to success that exist within the older CPS managed model.

BENEFITS OF MODEL:

Better Principal/School Relations

Principal survey responses utilizing IFM model show a significantly higher Principal satisfaction rating vs those with the custodial services only model.

Improved Health Inspection Results

Health inspection audits show a significant improvement under the IFM model vs those with the custodial services only model

Increased On-Site Management

Moving from a 1 to 20 schools building manager ratio to a 1 to 5 ratio

Better Data Management Resources

Both IFM Vendors and CPS Quality Assurance team will be using computer management systems and web based systems to collect, manage and report on performance

Blitz Inspections & Other Performance Metrics

Original 125 Schools

- Non-IFM schools
- 90 schools did not pass

Current Blitz Inspections

- Finishing remaining blitz inspections by month's end
- YTD, IFM schools are passing inspections at 20 percentage points better than non-IFM schools

Other Metrics

- Higher principal satisfaction at IFM schools compared to non-IFM schools
- Routine and preventative maintenance completion rates measurably better at IFM schools compared to non-IFM schools

Add'l Oversight & Accountability Measures for SY 18-19

- Department Strategy Re-Focus
 - Hiring Quality Assurance Team
 - Will inspect each school once a month
 - Will meet with Principal of each school/dedicated schedule
- New standard operating procedures (e.g. Supplier Corrective Action Response; SCAR)
- Revising vendor service-level agreements
- Fees at risk will begin being assessed against vendors for non-compliance
- Regular monthly meetings with vendor and CPS Leadership



IFM Recommendation

Three companies returned responses – ABM, Aramark and Sodexo

Committee Recommendation

- Sodexo Continue within current Zone 00, and award Zone 3 and Zone 4
- 3 Year Contract, with 2 (1) year options to renew
- Not-to-exceed \$168.6 million
