

## Waiver on School Improvement (Restructured Day)

## **Waiver Overview**



- The School Improvement (Restructured Day) waiver impacts
  Section 18-8.05 of the School Code.
  - Specifically, it allows the district to schedule up to 4 school improvement in-service days as a full day of student attendance provided that the district "bank" instructional minutes above the state required minutes across the other days of the year
- The district has utilized the waiver for the last 5 years. The waiver ended on June 2012, requiring CPS to renew.
- To renew the waiver, the district requires
  - Approval from the board <u>and</u>
  - Approval from the General Assembly

## **Impact on School Calendar**



Under the School Code school districts must establish 180 minimum total "student attendance days" to apply for General State Aid (GSA).

The GSA formula allows certain non-instructional days (i.e. parent-teacher conferences, teacher institute, school improvement days) to count toward the 180 minimum number of "student attendance days".

CPS is committed to a full school day and year. The waiver allows the district to better qualify for GSA when in circumstances beyond district control, the planned school calendar cannot be adhered to.

## Recommendation



- The Chief Executive Officer recommends approving a school improvement waiver application.
- The school improvement waiver would allow the district:
  - Flexibility in planning the school calendar
  - Provide up to 4 full days of in-service under Section 18-8.05 of the School Code (these days would be counted as part of the 10 PD days planned for SY2012-13)
