**REQUEST FOR DISMISSAL OF SAMUEL JOHNSON, PARENT ADVOCATE,
LATHROP ELEMENTARY SCHOOL**

TO THE CHICAGO BOARD OF EDUCATION

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER RECOMMENDS THE FOLLOWING:

That this Request for Dismissal and charges and specifications preferred by the Chief Executive Officer against Samuel Johnson be approved; that notice of his dismissal and a copy of this Board Report and accompanying charges and specifications be served upon him within ten 10 days of adoption of the Board Report.

DESCRIPTION:

Pursuant to Section 6 of Board Policy #95-1025-PO2 and the Rules of the Board of Education of the City of Chicago, the Chief Executive Officer charged Samuel Johnson, a parent advocate currently assigned to the Lathrop Elementary School, 1440 South Christiana Avenue, Chicago, Illinois 60623, with use of profane language or gestures in front of students, conduct that is cruel, immoral, negligent, criminal, or causes psychological or physical harm or injury to a student, behavior that is grossly disrupts the orderly educational process in the classroom, in the school, and may occur on or off the school grounds or assigned work location and conduct unbecoming a Chicago Public Schools' employee.

The Chief Executive Officer hereby requests the dismissal of Samuel Johnson from the employ of the Chicago Board of Education. Samuel Johnson has been afforded a discharge hearing and the Chief Executive Officer has suspended Samuel Johnson without pay.

He will be dismissed from employment immediately upon service of the notice of dismissal together with a copy of this Board Report and the charges and specifications.


