**AUTHORIZE CONTINUED RETENTION OF THE LAW FIRM
MAYER BROWN & PLATT**

THE GENERAL COUNSEL REPORTS THE FOLLOWING DECISION:

Continued retention of the law firm Mayer Brown & Platt.

DESCRIPTION: The law firm Mayer Brown & Platt has concluded its representation of the Board in the matter Near North Insurance Brokerage v. Board, et. al., which had been filed in the Circuit Court of Cook County. This litigation has been settled and the firm has pending invoices in the amount of \$12,000. Authorization is requested in this amount. The General Counsel has reviewed the invoice and deemed it satisfactory for payment.

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

Inspector General - Each party to the agreement shall acknowledge that, in accordance with 105 ILCS 5/34-13.1, the Inspector General of the Chicago Board of Education has the authority to conduct certain investigations and that the Inspector General shall have access to all information and personnel necessary to conduct those investigations.


Conflicts - The agreement shall not be legally binding on the Board if entered into in violation of the provisions of 105 ILCS 5/34-21.3 which restricts the employment of, or the letting of contracts to, former Board Members during the one year period following expiration or other termination of their terms of office.

Indebtedness - The Board's Indebtedness Policy adopted July 26, 1995, (95-0726-EX3), as amended from time to time, is hereby incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Ethics - The Board's Ethics Code adopted September 27, 1995, (95-0927-RU3), as amended from time to time, is hereby incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.


