RESOLUTION RE: THE 2000-2001 CHICAGO CITYWIDE MATH SCHOLARS

WHEREAS, the Chicago Citywide Mathematics League (CCML) is an association of Chicago public high schools that encourages students to demonstrate their mathematics proficiency in a series of 5 mathematics contests each year; and

WHEREAS, Math Scholars compete in Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra/Trigonometry, and Precalculus; and

WHEREAS, more than 130 seniors competed in pre-calculus at three regional locations: North, DeVry Institute of Technology; Central, University of Illinois at Chicago, and South, Kennedy-King College; and

WHEREAS, mathematics scholars had to use a variety of functions (e.g., exponential, inverse, radical, quadratic, and higher degree polynomial, rational, parametric, polar, logarithmic, trigonometric, step, and piece-wise) to describe number patterns, to represent graphically real-world situations, and to answer questions about them for the algebra, geometry and pre-calculus mathematics competition; and
