AUTHORIZE ENTERING INTO NEW AGREEMENTS WITH VARIOUS PRIVATE SPECIALIZED SCHOOLS, AND AUTHORIZE PAYMENTS TO PRIVATE SPECIALIZED SCHOOLS

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORTS THE FOLLOWING DECISION:

Authorize entering into new agreements with those private specialized schools listed on Exhibit "A" at a cost not to exceed the aggregate amount of \$118,000,000.00 over a two-year period. Student placements in private specialized schools are made either by the Board directly, by the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS), by the Department of Mental Health (DMH), or pursuant to court order. Written agreements for these private specialized schools are being negotiated. The Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) requires private specialized schools and local school districts to execute Nonpublic Facility Placement Contracts for each student being placed in a private specialized school. Whenever possible, the Board has each private specialized school sign a more detailed Private Specialized School Agreement, but executing these separate agreements is not required by law or by the Board. TERM: The term of the Private Specialized School Agreement for each school listed on Exhibit "A" is for 2 years commencing August 1, 2002 and ending July 31, 2004. Each agreement will have two (2) options to renew for periods of 2-years each.

SCOPE OF SERVICES: Each school will operate educationally and age appropriate programs, administer appropriate tests, develop and use customized Individualized Education Plans (IEP) for each student, provide student progress reports, and will comply with the service requirements specified in their Agreement.

COMPENSATION: Each private specialized school shall be paid the rate identified by the Illinois Purchased Care Review Board, not to exceed, in the aggregate, the sum of \$118,000,000.00 over a two-year period. It is anticipated that costs during the first year will not exceed \$58,000,000.00. Each agreement will contain a non appropriation clause and will provide that the Board is not obligated to place any students in vendor's private specialized school(s).

AUTHORIZATION: Authorize the General Counsel to include other relevant terms and conditions in the written contract documents. Authorize the President and Secretary to execute the contract documents. Authorize the Chief Specialized Services Officer to (i) execute all ancillary documents required to administer or effectuate these student placements, the contract documents and any new Private Specialized School Agreements, including but not limited to the Nonpublic Facility Placement contracts required by ISBE; (ii) place students in Private Specialized Schools not included on the attached list on an emergency basis when such placements are warranted by the students' Individual Education Plans, or when such placements are required by court order, by DCFS, or by DMH; and (iii) approve travel reimbursement for parents, guardians, and students making visits as a related service specified in the Individual Education Programs (IEP).

AFFIRMATIVE ACTION: Pursuant to section 3.7 of the Revised Remedial Plan for Minority and Women Business Enterprise Contract Participation (M/WBE Plan), this contract is exempt from review because the contract is for tuition payments.

LSC REVIEW: Local School Council approval is not applicable to this report.

Conflicts- The agreement shall not be legally binding on the Board if entered into in violation of the provisions of ILCS 5/34-21.3 which restricts the employment of, or the letting of contracts to, former Board member during the one-year period following expiration or other termination of their terms of office.

Indebtedness – The Board's Indebtedness Policy adopted July 26, 1995 (95-0726-EX3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Ethics – The Board's Ethics code adopted September 27, 1995 (95-0927-RU3), as amended from time to time, shall be incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Contingent Liability – The agreement shall contain the clause that any expenditure beyond the current fiscal year is deemed a contingent liability, subject to appropriation in the subsequent fiscal year budget(s).
