AUTHORIZE RETENTION OF THE LAW FIRM HODGES, LOIZZI, EISENHAMMER, RODICK & KOHN

THE GENERAL COUNSEL REPORTS THE FOLLOWING:

Retention of the law firm Hodges, Loizzi, Eisenhammer, Rodick & Kohn.

DESCRIPTION: The General Counsel has retained the services of the law firm Hodges, Loizzi, Eisenhammer, Rodick & Kohn to represent the Board in three matters requiring intervention before the Cook County Property Tax Appeal Board (PTAB). These tax assessment matters, which were filed by Dayton Hudson Corporation and Days Inn cannot be handled by originally-designated outside counsel due to a conflict. The Hodges firm has strong expertise in property tax assessment appeals and has been engaged by the General Counsel to pursue these three appeals. Authorization for the firm's services is requested in the amount of \$20,000. As invoices are received, they will be reviewed by the General Counsel and, if satisfactory, processed for payment.

GENERAL CONDITIONS:

Inspector General - Each party to the agreement shall acknowledge that, in accordance with 105 ILCS 5/34-13.1, the Inspector General of the Chicago Board of Education has the authority to conduct certain investigations and that the Inspector General shall have access to all information and personnel necessary to conduct those investigations.

Conflicts - The agreement shall not be legally binding on the Board if entered into in violation of the provisions of 105 ILCS 5/34-21.3 which restricts the employment of, or the letting of contracts to, former Board Members during the one year period following expiration or other termination of their terms of office.

Indebtedness - The Board's Indebtedness Policy adopted July 26, 1995, (95-0726-EX3), as amended from time to time, is hereby incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Ethics - The Board's Ethics Code adopted September 27, 1995, (95-0927-RU3), as amended from time to time, is hereby incorporated into and made a part of the agreement.

Contingent Liability - The agreement shall contain the clause that any expenditure beyond the current fiscal year is deemed a contingent liability, subject to appropriation in the subsequent fiscal year budget(s).
