Item 2: College Board	Can you give us a breakout of allocated funds for AP versus SAT?	Confidential information was provided per the request of Board Members.	Office of Teaching and Learning
Item 3: International Baccaloriate	There are some schools that want to add the IB program. Do you have any data on how much having an IB program influences parents to enroll their child in a school?	<p>At this time, Teaching and Learning does not have direct CPS survey data that isolates IB as the deciding factor for parent enrollment decisions. Enrollment trends suggest IB is a valued program and an important part of the academic portfolio that families consider when making school enrollment decisions, but there is no indication that families are choosing a school exclusively because of IB (although some of them certainly may).</p> <p>Some of CPS' IB programs are extremely popular while others are underenrolled. This is true for many types of programs (CTE, Arts, etc). One theory is that program offerings are a secondary consideration -- the primary consideration being the school itself.</p>	Office of Teaching and Learning
