President del Valle took the Chair and the meeting* being called to order there were then:

Dr. Janice Jackson, Chief Executive Officer, urged everyone to vote in the Local School Councils, and reminded all that schools are open today for in-person voting, as well as mail-in ballots that will be accepted until November 30th; provided updates on school safety plans; provided updates to the changes CPS is making to help support school-based staff during the city's current Stay at Home Advisory; and provided updates to welcoming Pre-K students and students in cluster programs back to the classroom in the new year.

Ms. LaTanya McDade, Chief Education Officer, Dr. Kenneth Fox, Chief Health Officer, Dr. Marielle Fricchione, Chicago Department of Public Health, and Mr. Arnie Rivera, Chief Operating Officer, provided a presentation on the Reopening Update.

ADOPT A NEW STUDENT ONLINE PERSONAL PROTECTION ACT (SOPPA) POLICY

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER RECOMMENDS THE FOLLOWING:

That the Board of Education ("Board") adopt a new Student Online Personal Protection Act (SOPPA) Policy effective July 1, 2021. The policy was posted online for public comment from October 2, 2020 to November 2, 2020.

PURPOSE: The state SOPPA law requires school districts to adopt a policy regarding the use of education technology products or applications, SOPPA is intended to ensure that student data will be protected when it is collected by educational technology companies and that the data may be used for beneficial purposes such as providing learning and innovative educational technologies. SOPPA requires: that school districts only use educational technologies that meet the following criteria: have been approved under this policy; all agreements between the Board and the provider are posted on district's website, and all of the data elements are listed on the district's website regardless if the Board pays for the tools or they are provided free of charge.

POLICY TEXT:

I. SCOPE OF THE POLICY: This policy outlines how Chicago Public Schools will comply with its responsibilities under SOPPA. This policy also provides how employees are authorized to use educational technology products or applications and which employees can enter into written agreements supporting or authorizing their use.

II. DEFINITIONS:

- a. Authorized Software refers to any unique application, service, tool, program, platform, mobile application, product, electronic, or online tool, including free or complimentary software product or tool, that has been reviewed and approved for use on the CPS Network. These tools can be found on the Board's Authorized Software Student facing site.
- Breach means the unauthorized acquisition of computerized data that compromises the security, confidentiality, or integrity of covered information maintained by an operator or school.
- c. Covered information means personally identifiable information or material or information that is linked to personally identifiable information or material in any media or format that is not publicly available and is any of the following:
 - Created by or provided to an operator by a student or the student's parent in the course of the student's or parent's use of the operator's site, service, or application for pre-K through 12 school purposes.
 - Created by or provided to an operator by an employee or agent of a school or school district for pre-K through 12 school purposes.
 - 3. Gathered by an operator through the operation of its site, service, or application for pre-K through 12 school purposes and personally identifies a student, including, but not limited to, the information in the student's educational record or electronic mail, first and last name, home address, telephone number, electronic mail address, or other information that allows physical or online contact, discipline records, test results, special education data, juvenile dependency records, grades, evaluations, criminal records, medical records, health records, a social security number, biometric information, disabilities, socioeconomic information, food purchases, political affiliations, religious information, text messages, documents, student identifiers, search activity, photos, voice recordings, or geolocation information.
- d. Department/School Management refers to the supervisor, manager, director, officer, principal, Network Chief, or other employees of the Board designated by their department or office or school to Implement policy compliance requirements.
- Educational Technology means educational software, electronic or online tools used by schools to improve student engagement, knowledge retention, individual learning or collaboration.

- f. Pre-K through 12 school purposes refers to purposes that are directed by or that customarily take place at the direction of a school, teacher, or school district; aid in the administration of school activities, including, but not limited to, instruction in the classroom or at home, administrative activities, and collaboration between students, school personnel, or parents; or are otherwise for the use and benefit of the school.
- g. Operator refers to the operator of an Internet website, online service, online application, or mobile application with actual knowledge that the site, service, or application is used primarily for pre-K through 12 school purposes and was designed and marketed for pre-K through 12 school purposes.
- Parent means a person who is the natural parent of the student or other person who has the primary responsibility for the care and upbringing of the student.
- i. Personally Identifiable Information (PII) refers to sensitive data and information that must be protected against unwarranted disclosure such as student information, private employee information and protected health information that can adversely affect the privacy or welfare of an individual.
- j. Prohibited Software refers to any software product or tool that is listed as 'prohibited for use' on the CPS Network. Prohibited software is identified after careful consideration and consensus amongst multiple departments that this technology has no place for Chicago Public Schools. The complete list of prohibited technology platforms is located on the district's AUP Guidance website: https://www.cps.edu/AcceptableUsePolicy/Pages/aup.aspx.
- k. Targeted advertising means presenting advertisements to a student where the advertisement is selected based on information obtained or inferred from that student's online behavior, usage of applications, or covered information. The term does not include advertising to a student at an online location-based upon that student's current visit to that location or in response to that student's request for information or feedback, without the retention of that student's online activities or requests over time for the purpose of targeting subsequent ads.

III. OPERATOR REQUIREMENTS:

Prior to entering into a written agreement with the district, operators must meet these minimum operator requirements.

- a. Operators must agree to the following:
 - Implement and maintain reasonable security procedures and practices that otherwise meet or exceed industry standards designed to protect covered information from unauthorized access, destruction, use, modification, or disclosure.
 - Publicly disclose material information about its collection, use, and disclosure of covered information with a privacy policy.
 - 3. Limitations on a student's covered information.
 - a) A student's covered information shall be collected only for pre-K through
 12 school purposes and not further processed in a manner that is incompatible with those purposes.
 - b) A student's covered information shall only be adequate, relevant, and limited to what is necessary in relation to the pre-K through 12 school purposes for which it is processed.
 - Notify the school of any breach of the students' covered information no later than 30 calendar days after the determination that a breach has occurred.
- b. Operators are prohibited from:
 - 1. Engaging in targeted activities.
 - Using information including persistent unique identifiers, created or gathered by the operator's site, service, or application to amass a profile about a student.
 - 3. Selling or renting a student's information.
 - Disclosing covered information, except for circumstances allowable under the SOPPA policy.

IV. REQUIREMENTS FOR APPROVING AUTHORIZED SOFTWARE:

- Department/School Management may initiate an approval request for authorized software to meet an educational or operational need. The request will go through the following onboarding process.
 - Initial Screening The CEO or designee will create a minimum standard for software to be authorized (educational purpose and IT security).
 - The onboarding process requires the reviews of the software by the following Departments:
 - Education Technology a further review of Ed-Tech Operations to determine if an education technology software meets the educational needs and requirements to be onboarded.

- a) Libraries and Instructional Technology
- b) Information Technology Services (ITS)
 - (1) Information Security Information Security will validate the operator has implemented and maintains reasonable security procedures and practices that otherwise meet or exceed industry standards designed to protect covered information from unauthorized access, destruction, use, modification, or disclosure.
 - (2) Enterprise Architecture How does the application fit in the current CPS environment.
 - (3) Information Technology Infrastructure Review operators for any ITS infrastructure requirements.
 - (4) Project Management Office, Change Management and Training to determine the steps required to implement the solution
- Law Operators must agree to a contract that conforms with this policy and with SOPPA.
- d) Procurement Create operator/sponsorship in CPS vendor database.
- e) Risk Review operator's background check and insurance policy.
- b. The Chief Educational Officer, Chief Procurement Officer, General Counsel, or their respective designee are the only school employees who may enter into a written agreement with operators. Any agreement or contract entered into by employees other than those listed above is in violation of SOPPA is void and unenforceable as against public policy.
- c. All operators must have an agreement with the district posted on the public-facing district website, listing student data being transferred and all other information required by SOPPA before the software can be used in the district. If a program or platform is identified that does not have an agreement posted, that software use will be discontinued immediately and not reinstated until brought into compliance with an agreement posted including data field in use.

V. AUTHORIZED SOFTWARE:

- Department/School Management or designee has the authority to select from a comprehensive list of authorized software.
- Department/School Management may seek approval through the operator onboarding process to request an addition to the comprehensive list of authorized software.
- No employee may use prohibited software.

VI. RESPONSIBILITIES FOR USING AUTHORIZED SOFTWARE:

- a. School Use Procedures
 - 1. The principal must ensure teachers and staff are using authorized software.
 - Principals may request approval for authorized software as noted in Section V of this policy.
- b. Teacher and Staff Responsibilities
 - Teachers and staff must receive approval from the principal prior to using authorized software.
 - Teachers and staff must inform parents of the purpose of using the authorized software and if necessary obtain consent for use of authorized software.
- c. Parent and Student Rights
 - Parents have the right to Inspect and review the student's covered information, request from a school a paper or electronic copy of the student's covered information, and request corrections of factual inaccuracies contained in the student's covered information.
 - Parents have the right to know which authorized software are being used in the classroom and to consent to the use of authorized software
 - Parents have the right to be notified by the school or school district of a breach by an operator.

VII. WEBSITE POSTING:

The district will maintain and post the following on its website:

- a. All data elements that the school district collects, maintains or discloses to any person, entity, or third party, or governmental agency used will be posted on the school's website. The post on the website must explain how the school district uses, to whom or what entitles it discloses, and for what purposes it discloses the data elements/covered information.
- All written agreements with operators involving SOPPA must be posted on the school district's website before the software can be used in the district.

c. A list of the operators that the school has written agreements with, including the copy of the agreement, the business address of each operator, whether the operator uses any subcontractors, and if so, a list of any subcontractors to whom covered information is being disclosed or a link to the operator's website where a list of these subcontractors is provided.

VIII. AUTHORIZATION TO ISSUE PROCEDURES AND GUIDELINES

The CEO or designee is authorized to establish guidelines as necessary to effectively implement the requirements of this policy, including when to revoke or review authorized software and how parents access their rights.

IX. ENFORCEMENT

Violations of this policy or any guidelines issued pursuant to or in relation to this policy are prohibited. Employees who commit violations may be subject to discipline. Operators who commit violations may result in their products or tools becoming prohibited.

THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER RECOMMENDS THE FOLLOWING:

Authorize renewal of the Chicago International Charter School Agreement (the "Charter School Agreement") with conditions for an additional seven-year period. A new Charter School Agreement applicable to this renewal term will be negotiated. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written Charter School Agreement is not executed by the Board and the charter school's governing board within 120 days of the date of this Board Report. The agreement authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education. Information pertinent to this renewal is stated below.

This August 2017 amendment is necessary to authorize an extension of the term of the Charter School Agreement from its current end date of June 30, 2022 to June 30, 2024. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written Charter School Agreement is not executed by the Board and the charter school's governing board within 120 days of the date of this amended Board Report.

This April 2018 amendment is necessary to authorize a change in the education management organization for the following campuses of Chicago International Charter School, effective July 1, 2018: (a) Lloyd Bond Campus from Charter Schools USA to Chicago Rise LLC and (b) Longwood and Loomis Primary Campuses from Charter Schools USA to Ignite Learning Collaborative LLC. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written Charter School Agreement is not executed by the Board and the charter school's governing board within 120 days of the date of this amended Board Report. The agreement authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education.

This July 2019 amendment is necessary to ratify Chicago Charter School Foundation's termination of the education management organization agreements for the following campuses of Chicago International Charter School, effective July 1, 2019: (a) Lloyd Bond Campus from Chicago Rise LLC, and (b) Longwood and Loomis Primary Campuses from Empowered Community Schools (f/k/a Ignite Learning Collaborative LLC). The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written Charter School Agreement is not executed by the Board and the charter school's governing board within 120 days of the date of this amended Board Report. The agreement authorized herein will only take effect upon certification by the Illinois State Board of Education.

This November 2020 amendment is necessary to authorize (a) the voluntary closure of the Chicago International Charter School – ChicagoQuest North Campus at the end of the 2020-2021 school year by mutual consent of the parties for the reasons set forth below, (b) an amendment to the Charter School Agreement with respect to that campus closure, and (c) a campus wind down agreement for the ChicagoQuest North Campus. The Chicago Charter School Foundation provided notice to the Office of Portfolio Management in September 2020 of its intent to close the ChicagoQuest North campus at the end of the 2020-2021 school year. The Chicago Charter School Foundation shall wind down and cease operations of that campus voluntarily effective July 1, 2021. After the closure of that campus, the overall network-level at capacity enrollment for the charter school shall decrease to 8,661 students by the fall of 2021. The authority granted herein shall automatically rescind in the event a written amendment to the Charter School Agreement is not executed by the Board and the charter school's governing board within 120 days of the date of this amended Board Report.

ORIGINAL AGREEMENT: The original Charter School Agreement (authorized by Board Report 97-0122-EX4 as amended by Board Report 00-0223-EX3) was for a term commencing July 1, 1997 and ending June 30, 2002 and authorized the operation of a charter school serving no more than 5,000 students in grades K through 12. The charter and Charter School Agreement were subsequently renewed for a term commencing July 1, 2002 and ending June 30, 2007 (authorized by Board Report 01-1219-EX2). The charter and Charter School Agreement were further renewed for a term commencing July 1, 2007 and ending June 30, 2012, serving no more than 7,647 students (authorized by Board Report 07-0523-EX5). The charter and Charter School Agreement were then renewed for a term commencing July 1, 2012 and ending June 30, 2017, serving no more than 10,111 students (authorized by Board Report 12-0328-EX11). The charter and Charter School Agreement were subsequently amended as follows:

- Board Report 14-1022-EX4: Ratified the authorization to change the educational management organization at Chicago International Charter School Irving Park Campus from Victory Educational Partners to Distinctive Schools effective July 1, 2013. Also corrected the at capacity enrollment at Chicago International Charter School Ralph Ellison Campus from 630 to 570 students which decreased the overall at capacity enrollment of the charter school from 10,111 to 10,051 students. Also approved an increase in the at capacity enrollment at Chicago International Charter School Northtown Campus by 50 students to 900 students which increased the overall at capacity enrollment of the charter school to 10,101 students in spring of 2015.
- Board Report 15-0527-EX22: Ratified the authorization to change the education management
 organization for the following campuses of the Chicago International Charter School from Edison
 Schools Inc. to Charter Schools USA, effective July 1, 2012: Larry Hawkins Campus, Lloyd Bond
 Campus, Longwood Campus and Loomis Primary Campus. Also corrected the at capacity
 enrollment for Chicago International Charter School Ralph Ellison Campus from 570 to 630
 students thus Increasing the overall at capacity enrollment of the charter school from 10,101 to
 10,161 students.

- Board Report 15-1216-EX2: Revoked the Chicago International Charter School Larry Hawkins Campus at the end of 2015-2016 school year, thus decreasing the overall at capacity enrollment of the charter school to 9,261 students by the fall of 2016. Also authorized an amendment to the Charter School Agreement and a campus wind down agreement with respect to the revocation of the Larry Hawkins Campus.
- Board Report 16-0427-EX10: Ratified the authorization to change the education management
 organization for the following campuses of Chicago International Charter School from Victory to
 ReGeneration Schools, effective January 1, 2016: Avalon/South Shore Campus, Basil Campus
 and Washington Park Campus. Also changed the student enrollment capacity for Chicago
 International Charter School from the individual campus-level to the network-level beginning in the
 fall of 2016. The overall network-level at capacity enrollment of the charter school will remain
 unchanged at 9,261 students.

CHARTER RENEWAL PROPOSAL: Chicago Charter School Foundation submitted a renewal proposal on September 14, 2016 to continue the operation of Chicago International Charter School under a unified mission using, Civitas, Chicago Quest, Distinctive Schools, Charter Schools USA and ReGeneration Schools for comprehensive school management services. The charter school shall continue to serve grades K through 12 with a maximum enrollment of 9,261 students. The student enrollment capacity for the charter school shall continue to be at the network-level. The charter school can change student enrollment between campuses based on parameters set forth in the agreement so long as the overall network-level at capacity enrollment of the charter school does not change.

Also, in December 2015, the governing board of Chicago Charter School Foundation voted to no longer serve grades 6 through 8 at the Chicago International Charter School - ChicagoQuest North Campus beginning in the 2016-2017 school year. In December 2015, Chicago International Charter School held parent meetings to support families with placement at other Chicago International Charter School campuses. All 8th grade students were supported in matriculating to the 9th grade at ChicagoQuest North. Beginning in the 2016-2017 school year, no 6th_8th grade students were enrolled at ChicagoQuest North.

In October 2016, Chicago Charter School Foundation submitted a material modification to the Office of Innovation and Incubation to only serve grades 9 through 12 at the Chicago International Charter School - ChicagoQuest North Campus.

The Office of Innovation and Incubation recommends ratifying the authorization for Chicago Charter School Foundation to only serve grades 9 through 12 at the Chicago International Charter School - ChicagoQuest North Campus, effective July 1, 2016.

In February 2017, Chicago Charter School Foundation submitted an application for amendment to extend its Charter School Agreement beyond a five-year term. The term of the Charter School Agreement is being extended from its current end date of June 30, 2022 to June 30, 2024. A public hearing on the proposed extension was held on Monday, August 21, 2017. The hearing was recorded and a summary report is available for review.

In April 2018, Chicago Charter School Foundation submitted an application for amendment to change the education management organization for the following campuses of Chicago International Charter School, effective July 1, 2018: (a) Lloyd Bond Campus from Charter Schools USA to Chicago Rise LLC and (b) Longwood and Loomis Primary Campuses from Charter Schools USA to Ignite Learning Collaborative LLC.

A public hearing on the proposed changes was held on Wednesday, April 11, 2018. The hearing was recorded and a summary report is available for review.

In May 2019, Chicago Charter School Foundation submitted a letter to the Office of Innovation and Incubation requesting to terminate the education management organization agreements for the following campuses of Chicago International Charter School, effective July 1, 2019: (a) Lloyd Bond Campus from Chicago Rise LLC, and (b) Longwood and Loomis Primary Campuses from Empowered Community Schools (f/k/a Ignite Learning Collaborative LLC).

A public hearing on the proposed changes was held on Monday, July 15, 2019. The hearing was recorded and a summary report is available for review.

On September 29, 2020, the Chicago Charter School Foundation provided the Office of Portfolio Management written notice of its intent to close the Chicago International Charter School – ChicagoQuest North Campus at the end of the 2020-2021 school year due to declining student enrollment and financial viability. In late September 2020, the Chicago Charter School Foundation notified all families of the closure of the ChicagoQuest North Campus at the end of the 2020-2021 school year. A remote public hearing on the proposed closure was held on Tuesday, November 10, 2020. The hearing was recorded and a summary report is available for review.

The Office of Portfolio Management recommends an amendment to the Charter School Agreement with respect to the closure of the Chicago Quest North campus at the end of the 2020-2021 school year by mutual consent of the parties. The Chicago Charter School Foundation shall wind down and cease operations of that campus voluntarily effective July 1, 2021. Both parties shall enter into a campus wind down agreement with respect to the campus closure. After the closure of that campus, the overall network-level at capacity enrollment for the charter school shall decrease by 600 students to 8.661 students by the fall of 2021.

The agreement will incorporate an accountability plan in which the charter school is evaluated by the Board each year based on numerous factors related to its academic, financial and operational performance.

CHARTER EVALUATION: After receiving the charter renewal proposal, the Office of Innovation and Incubation conducted a comprehensive evaluation of Chicago International Charter School's academic performance, financial viability, and legal and contract compliance. This evaluation included a review of the proposal, academic results, financial performance, governance documents, parental issues, facilities surveys, and special education documentation. A public hearing was held on November 21, 2016 for all contract and charter schools going through renewals to receive public comments, including Chicago International Charter School. The Office of Innovation and Incubation recommends that, based on the school's performance on these and other accountability criteria, as well as the school's demonstration of intent to satisfy the "Additional Terms and Conditions" referred to herein below, Chicago International Charter School be authorized to continue operating as a charter school.

RENEWAL TERM: The term of Chicago International Charter School's charter and agreement is being extended for a seven (7) year term commencing July 1, 2017 and ending June 30, 2024.

ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS: Additional terms and conditions will be communicated to the charter school by the Chief Executive officer or his designee in a formal Letter of Conditions and will be included as an attachment to the Charter School Agreement with Chicago Charter School Foundation.

AUTHORIZATION: Authorize the General Counsel to include relevant terms and conditions, including any indemnities to be provided to the charter school, in the written Charter School Agreement, amendment and campus wind down agreement. Authorize the President and Secretary to execute the written Charter School Agreement, amendment and campus wind down agreement. Authorize the Executive Director of the Office of Innevation and Incubation Chief Portfolio Officer to issue a letter notifying the Illinois State Board of Education of the voluntary closure of the campus action(s) approved hereunder and to submit the approved proposal and signed Charter School Agreement to the Illinois State Board of Education for certification as well as any other information as may be necessary due to the closure of the campus. Authorize the General Counsel to further negotiate and execute any amendments to the Charter School Agreement as required by the Illinois State Board of Education.

LSC REVIEW: Approval of Local School Council is not applicable to this report.

FINANCIAL: The financial implications will be addressed during the development of the 20<u>4921</u>-20<u>2022</u> fiscal year budget. Since the School Code of Illinois prohibits the incurring of any liability unless an appropriation has been previously made, expenditures beyond FY4921 are deemed to be contingent liabilities only, subject to appropriation in subsequent fiscal year budgets.

Inspector General - Each party to the agreement shall acknowledge that, in accordance with 105 ILCS 5/34-13.1, the Inspector General of the Board of Education has the authority to conduct certain investigations and that the Inspector General shall have access to all information and personnel necessary to conduct those investigations.

Work Involves all labor, material and equipment required to construct new schools, additions, and annexes, or to renovate existing facilities, all as called for in the plans and specifications for the respective projects. These construction contract changes have been processed and are being submitted to the Board for approval in accordance with section 7-13 of the Rules of the Board of Education of the City of Chicago, since they require an increased commitment necessitated by an unforeseen combination of circumstances or conditions calling for immediate action to protect Board property to prevent interference with school sessions.

LSC REVIEW: Local School Council approval is not applicable to this report.

AFFIRMATIVE ACTION: The General Contracting Services Agreements entered into by each of the prequalified general contractors and other miscellaneous construction contracts awarded outside the prequalified general contractor program for new construction awards and changes to existing construction contracts shall be subject to the Board's Business Diversity Program for Construction Projects and any revisions or amendments to that policy that may be adopted during the term of any such contract.

FINANCIAL: Expenditures involved in the Capital Improvement Program are charged to the Department of Operations, Capital Improvement Program.

Budget classification: Fund – 412, 425, 427, 431, 435, 436, 437, 439, 485, 486, 487 & 488 will be used for all Change Orders (November Change Order Log); Funding source for new contracts is so indicated on Appendix A

PROPERTY TO BE LEASED TO THE BOARD: The CPD shall lease to the Board approximately 2.5 acres of land, more or less, attached to the existing CPD Field House located at the southeast corner of Fullerton and Meade Avenues, Chicago, Illinois. The general project area is as described on Exhibit A attached hereto.

TERM OF THE IGA: The term of the IGA shall commence upon the date the agreement is signed and shall end forty (40) years from the date a certificate of occupancy is issued for the School, which term shall automatically renew for one (1) successive forty (40) year period unless the Board notifies the CPD of its intention not to renew at least 120 days prior to the renewal term.

BASIC TERMS OF THE IGA: The IGA will provide for the lease of the land and the shared use of facilities after construction by the Board. CPD shall receive exclusive usage of portions of the School project and shared usage of some of the athletic and recreational facilities at no cost to the CPD. The parties shall designate in the IGA those facilities and improvements which shall be exclusive and/or shared and shall formulate a schedule as to the usage of the shared facilities.

CONSTRUCTION OF NEW BUILDING: The Board shall have the right to construct a new building on the leased land for school purposes only, and to make any and all other improvements upon the land, including, but not limited to a parking lot, recreational facilities, a fire lane and open space.

RENT: The rent for the term of the ground lease shall be \$1.00 per annum.

INSURANCE/INDEMNIFICATION: Insurance and indemnification provisions shall be negotiated by the General Counsel.

AUTHORIZATION: Authorize the President and Secretary to execute the IGA. Authorize the Chief Operating Officer or his designee to negotiate the final terms and conditions of the IGA including the exclusive and/or shared usage facilities and to execute any and all ancillary documents required to administer or effectuate the IGA. Authorize the General Counsel to include other relevant terms and conditions, including indemnification, in the IGA.

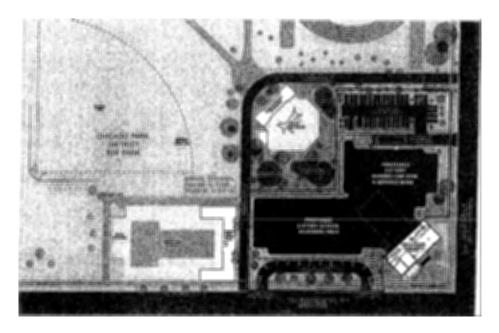
