



## **Decline in Case Volume due to COVID-19**




- When remote learning began on 3/17, the volume of cases OSP received each week fell by over 90% compared to the in-person portion of the 2nd semester
- Case volume per week has been higher in the current semester than during the remote portion of the previous semester, but far below first semester of SY20

# **Minimal Changes in Case Type**



- Lower frequency in all case types during remote learning period
- Student-on-Student cases have fallen as a proportion of total cases, but have still made up roughly two-thirds of all cases




 As students began interacting virtually instead of in-person, Sexual Electronic Communication more than doubled as a proportion of total cases, while Inappropriate Touching fell by more than half

## Protecting Chicago Children's Task Force Dashboard

### **Differences Among Complaints Across Student Populations**



OSP will create and distribute monthly materials that address (1) high priority and culturally responsive information and (2) the needs of high risk populations.



### Data

- Launch **survey** later this fall
- Incorporate intersectional data analysis into the PCC Dashboard
- Conduct analysis of respondent data to identify trends for students and adults who allegedly caused harm

### Communications

- Present future findings and progress at future OSP Quarterly Board Briefings
- Partner with the Association of Title IX Administrators (ATIXA) to continue to share and identify best practices
- Develop **culturally responsive communications** based on differences in data

## Prevention

• Complete procurement process to launch **prevention pilot project**
